The next Wednesday Evening Conversation exploring the important Shin Buddhist text "The Tannisho" will take place on February 23rd, beginning at 7.15 for 7.30pm and running until 9pm.

At the end of last year, I began to explore this text with you because I could see that it connected powerfully with the philosophy and theology of our own Unitarian and Universalist tradition and because it speaks well to many contemporary issues facing us as a contemporary liberal religious community. Since then I've done a lot more research and have discovered that between 1887 and 1922 a number of intimate, direct connections were made between Shin Buddhists and Unitarians and Universalists in Japan (see, for example HERE and HERE.
