Advent/Christmas appeal

Many thanks to everyone who supported our special appeal during December.

We are pleased to say that we have handed over a cheque for £408 to Rowan, a Cambridge based charity and arts centre that brings artists and learning-disabled people together.

You may be interested to visit Rowan's current exhibition - Portrait: new print works from Rowan.

This runs from 25 January to 6 February 2016 at the Michaelhouse Centre, Trinity Street, Cambridge, CB2 1SU. Michaelhouse is open 8am to 5pm Monday-Saturday.

This exhibition profiles the extraordinary print work emerging from Rowan, by our learning-disabled students. Since opening their print room a year ago, the students have been working with artists learning how to use a variety of techniques including monoprint, intaglio and relief printing.

Portrait: New print works from Rowan presents a range of portraits and self-portraits. Within this theme, students have tried to capture more than just a representation, incorporating the uniqueness and essence of the individual that create powerful and striking images.

A wide variety of interests are explored by Rowan's students within their practice, such as nature, memory and identity and these are also on display in this exhibition.

This exhibition explores how art has the power to develop confidence, self-esteem and wellbeing. Rowan's students benefit from the transformative power of the visual arts and this can be life-changing.

Accessibility project:

improving access to church and hall

The church committee has recently appointed the firm of Arch:Angel as our church architects. They are a small firm, based just outside Cambridge at Impington, and specialise in work with churches. Their website shows many local examples of their design work. They will be doing the regular 5-yearly inspection of our buildings.

Many of you will be aware that our church and hall are not very easily accessible for wheelchair users and parents with buggies. Currently we use a folding ramp which has to be fetched out of the shed on request, set in place, and then removed and stored away afterwards.

Nor do we have a proper accessible toilet.

Our church and hall are regularly used as a venue for community groups and events and we are keen to ensure that the premises are as good as possible.

For some time we've been wondering what to do about making these improvements. Now we have asked Arch: Angel to produce plans for creating redesigning the toilets, creating some storage space, installing a ramp linking the hall, the church, the street and the garden, and possibly creating a canopy between the church and hall.

We'll need to seek planning permission, of course, and to schedule any work carefully to minimise disruption to regular users of our buildings.

When it comes to money, we shall be seeking grant aid, and in this, we are being greatly helped by the expertise of a regular attender at church services, Rosemary Watson. We may also be able to use money from a recent bequest to the church. We see these improvements as a practical outworking of our ministry to the local community, and for that reason may be able to use some of our Ministry Development Fund to support the project.

Ideally we'd have liked to get the work done during August 2016, when our hall is deliberately kept free of lettings. But the timetable of grant-making bodies and of building firms may mean that the project can't be completed until into 2017. The detailed timetable and phasing of the work have yet to be agreed.

It's an exciting prospect, and we plan to consult not only with the congregation, but also with the many people and organisations who hire our facilities.
