Campus Ministry

We are exploring the possibility of a 'campus ministry'. This would most likely involve setting up a Unitarian society at Cambridge University, trying to forge a link with the Student Christian Movement and developing our existing, but very tenuous, links with the Progressive Christian Network. It was decided in principle to allocate up to £10,000 of our Ministry Development Fund to this venture. Details are still to be worked out. Andrew Bethune and Andrew Brown are in discussion with Susanna Hartland, and Joan Cook of the General Assembly of Unitarian and Free Christian Churches (GA). We are hoping that the GA may be able to provide some funding. It's a great opportunity for our church to engage with the educational community of our city.

Accessibility Project

The Cambridge City Council Planning Department has now indicated their general approval of our outline plans for a ramp and canopy linking our two buildings, subject to some conditions about materials, visibility of the canopy from the street and methods of attaching the canopy to the buildings. The internal work (redesigning the toilet facilities) does not need planning permission. Our architects (Arch:Angel) are now starting to prepare detailed plans.
