Progressive Christianity Network

Last month, we welcomed Rev Adrian Alker to our church to speak on the topic of 'Is a radical church possible?' at one of our Freethinkers events. Adrian is currently chair of the Progressive Christianity Network Britain, a membership organisation which works to promote and support open and contemporary Christian understanding. There is a network of local groups across the country. PCN publishes a radical quarterly newsletter, organises conferences and events, and enjoys links with other progressive Christian movements around the world. Our church is listed, along with several other Unitarian congregations, on PCN's website as a community where progressives and questioners are welcomed.

PCN Britain doesn't have a creed or statement of faith, but offers 'Eight Points' as an expression of the Christian life. They seem to me to chime very closely with our ethos in this church, which, to quote our website, 'looks to Christian culture, and to a modern, minimalist form of spiritual thought and practice'.

[Members of PCN] are people who:

- seek God, however understood, guided by the life and teachings of Jesus
- affirm that there are many ways to experience the Sacred and that we can draw on diverse sources of wisdom on our spiritual journeys.
- recognise that following Jesus leads us to act with compassion and to confront evil.
- place hospitality at the centre of our communal and worshipping life and see the sharing of bread and wine as an expression of our common humanity.
- seek to build communities that accept all who wish to share companionship without insisting on conformity.
- know that the way we behave towards others is the fullest expression of our faith.
- gain more insights in the search for understanding than we do in certainty.
- work together within and beyond the Church to achieve a just, peaceful and sustainable world.
